INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES

The objective of the Cigogne UCITS - Credit Opportunities fund is to generate an absolute return by exploiting a multi-strategy approach focused on the Credit theme, while maintaining a low correlation with main market trends. The sub-fund implements strategies on different types of debt securities and other debt instruments issued by public and/or private issuers worldwide. These strategies can be broken down into four main areas: relative value strategies designed to profit from price anomalies amongst debt securities and/or financial derivatives; convertible bond arbitrage strategies seeking to take advantage of market anomalies that may occur between the various components of a convertible bond; credit strategies designed to profit from excess credit returns or price anomalies in the spread on debt securities and credit derivatives; global macro strategies implemented for hedging purposes or in order to take advantage of opportunities that may arise depending on market configurations.

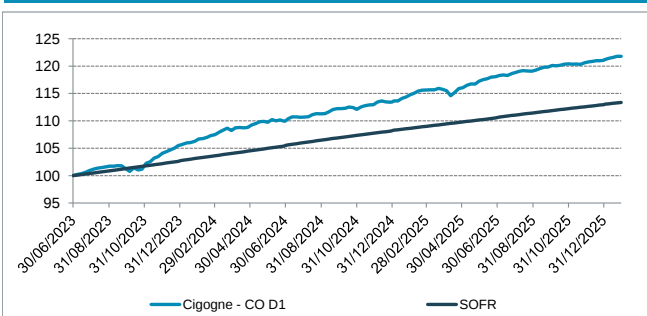

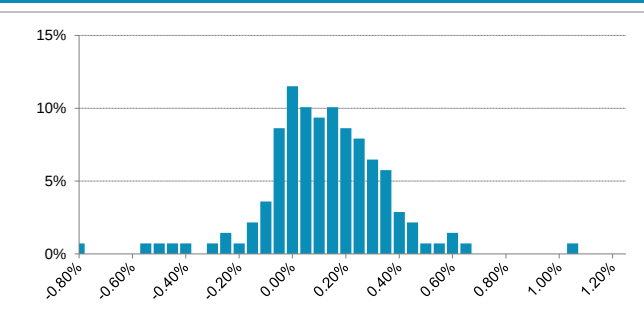

INVESTMENT MANAGERS' COMMENTARY

In January 2026, the global economy enters the year on a broadly resilient trajectory, underpinned by a stable macroeconomic environment. On both sides of the Atlantic, growth remains solid, albeit showing gradual signs of normalisation. In Europe, the swift resolution of certain trade uncertainties has bolstered business and consumer confidence, helping to stabilise markets. Meanwhile, the Greenland question, which had attracted particular attention, has been clarified, easing concerns on this matter. Against this backdrop, eurozone economic sentiment edged up to 99.4, its highest level since 2023. Inflation also continues to converge toward the ECB's target, fostering conditions conducive to monetary stability and the ongoing economic normalisation. In the United States, activity remains well oriented, with the IMF estimating growth at 2.4%, while the labour market shows a slight adjustment following several years of tightness. This dynamic encourages central banks to maintain a cautious approach. In January, both the ECB and the Federal Reserve left their policy rates unchanged, favouring confirmation of a durable disinflationary path before any shift in monetary policy. In financial markets, Investment Grade bond spreads in Europe tightened, reflecting a diminished risk perception. Equity markets also benefited from a renewed appetite for risk and the lifting of trade uncertainties: the EuroStoxx 50 rose +2.7%, outperforming the S&P 500, which posted a more modest gain of +1.4%. At the start of the year, the fund posted a positive return, driven by a supportive technical environment and selective allocation choices. The Investment Grade primary market fell short of expectations in terms of volume, while remaining active. This measured supply, set against sustained demand, fuelled a credit spread tightening movement, more pronounced in the euro market, which notably benefited positions in RCI Banque 03/29 and Stellantis 01/28. This dynamic was further extended by a compression of bond/CDS bases, as illustrated by the Ford 09/27 and Unibail 01/27 exposures hedged via 03/27 protection. In parallel, despite broadly contained primary flows, several transactions were initiated at levels deemed attractive, notably on BBVA FRN 01/29. In the sovereign segment, positions in South Africa 07/26 and the new Colombia 01/29 issuance generated a steady contribution, consolidating the month's performance. The High Yield segment was also contributive, while the contingent convertible pocket benefited from the positive trend in the banking sector. Positions in AT1 ABN C31 and Commerzbank C31 were the main performance drivers over the period. Finally, profits were taken on the mixed convertible bond position Qiagen 09/32, at an implied volatility level deemed opportune. As a replacement, a position was initiated in RedCare 04/32 following the exercise of the put on the 01/28 convertible, thereby extending maturity. New positions were also opened in Apcoa 04/31 and Worldline 07/26, with a view to diversification and optimisation of the risk/return profile.

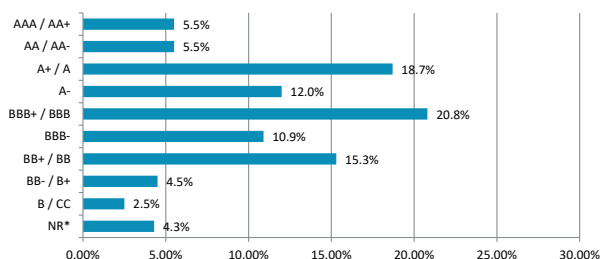

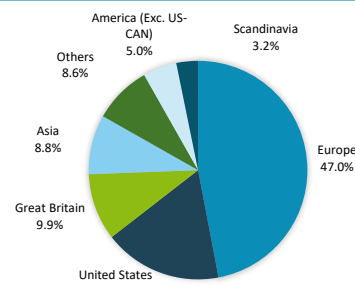


RATINGS BREAKDOWN

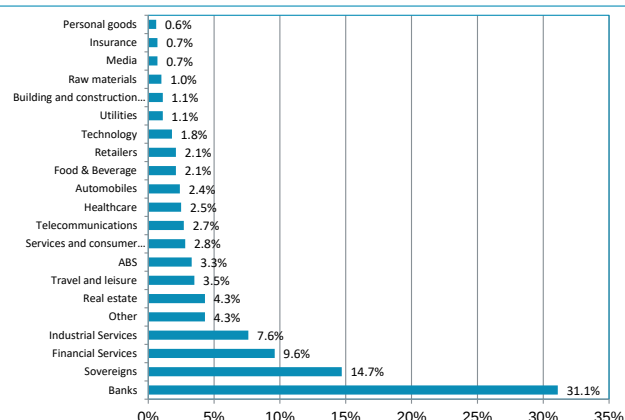

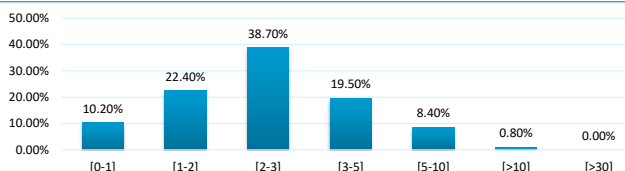
GEOGRAPHICAL BREAKDOWN



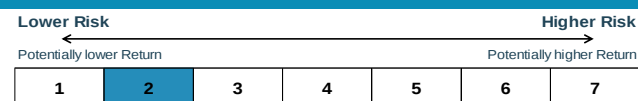
SECTORIAL BREAKDOWN
