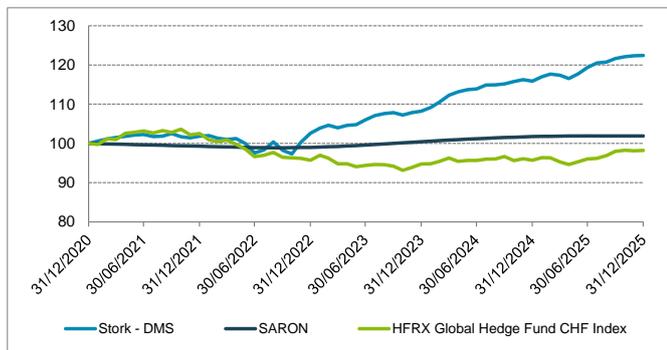

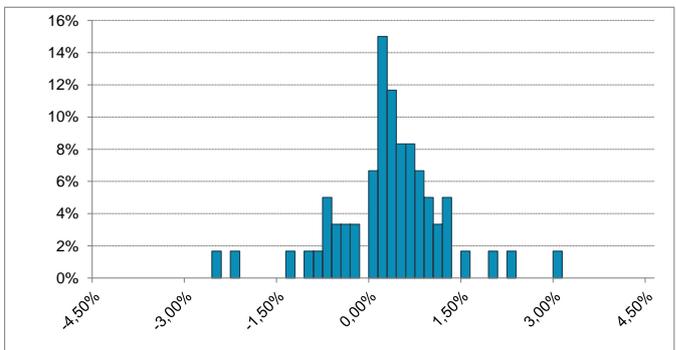

PERFORMANCE (NAV) FOR 5 YEARS



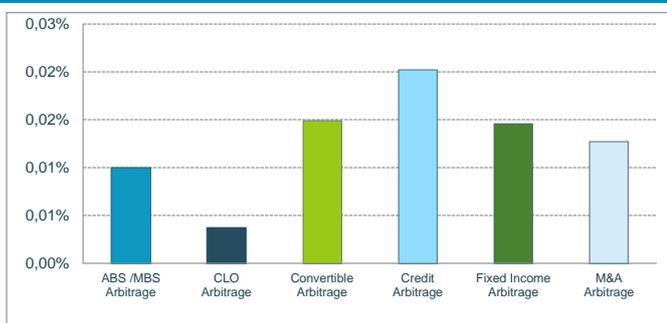
DISTRIBUTION OF MONTHLY RETURNS FOR 5 YEARS



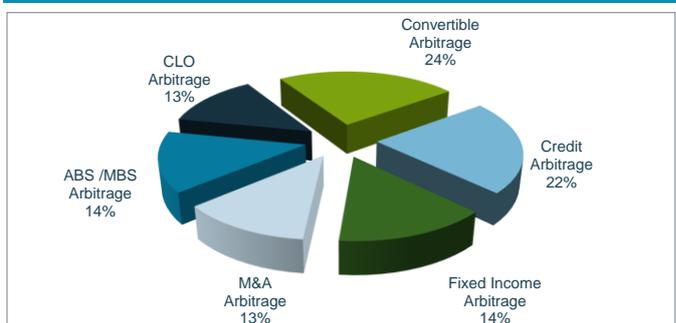
INVESTMENT MANAGERS' COMMENTARY

The Stork DMS Fund closed a very strong year in 2025, delivering a positive performance at year-end. The year began in a challenging environment, marked in the spring by trade tensions following the so-called "Liberation Day" tariff announcements, which temporarily weighed on economic visibility and heightened market volatility. Conditions gradually normalized as trade agreements and preliminary deals were reached, providing greater clarity for economic agents. Global growth remained solid, close to 3%, exceeding expectations. In the United States, the economy maintained a robust trajectory, supported by consumption and structural investment. In the euro area, the recovery remained more moderate, constrained by weakness in the industrial sector but partially supported by targeted fiscal measures. This backdrop allowed central banks to gradually adjust their monetary policy stance. Equity markets ended the year sharply higher, with the Eurostoxx 50 up 18.3%, while in credit markets the 5-year iTraxx Main tightened by around 50 bps, with the Crossover index returning toward 240 bps. All investment segments contributed to the annual performance, albeit to varying degrees. Fixed Income activity was one of the main drivers: the "Liberation Day" episode led to a steepening of US and euro yield curves, creating opportunities on these strategies before repositioning toward a flattening scenario. Geopolitical tensions revived inflation expectations, tightened credit spreads, and allowed profits to be taken on asset swaps on core sovereigns and supranational agencies. The postponement of customs tariffs also supported emerging markets, generating gains for instance on Turkey 2035 and Mexico 2033. The Credit segment also made a meaningful contribution, supported by timely and attractive entry points on Vonovia 04/27 and Vinci 04/28, as well as basis arbitrage strategies such as ING 03/29 versus CDS 06/28 or Rolls-Royce 10/27 versus CDS 12/27. Securitization delivered a more modest contribution, mainly through carry. Primarily invested in senior tranches, these positions were affected by record issuance volumes. While performance largely reflected the steady yield of structured assets in a stable secondary market, it points to significant potential for 2026. Within equity-oriented strategies, the Convertible segment was a major performance driver, supported by active management and a favorable environment for risk assets. Contributions were positive both in the financial segment, underpinned by the strength of the European banking sector, and in the corporate segment, benefiting from improving earnings. Contingent convertibles such as Crédit Agricole 7.5% C30 and BNP Paribas 7.75% C29 fully benefited from spread tightening, while corporate positions such as Figearc 10/28 stood out. Timely exits from securities such as Glanbia 01/27 and the RAG/Evonik exchangeable 06/26 allowed gains to be crystallized at attractive volatility levels. Finally, the M&A segment also contributed to the fund's annual success, benefiting from a renewed dynamic environment, particularly in the United States during the second half of the year. By way of example, the significant revaluation of Inhibrx Biosciences, supported by encouraging clinical results, and the increase in the offer price following the bidding battle for the acquisition of SatixFy Communications, strengthened the fund's results in 2025.

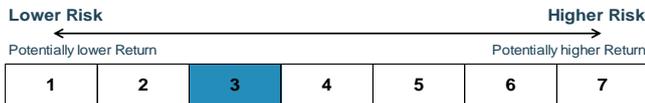
